Future field trips: Next field trip was this Saturday at the SDSMT Museum of Geology. Currently there are no other field trips planned. It was discussed to call Fossil Finder in Hot Springs for February's field trip.

Increase in the purchase of raffle tickets starts this month. Tickets are 50 cents/ 2 for a dollar.

Field trip waiver: Debra reviewed and stated that we should not shorten the waiver. She reviewed other clubs waivers and they all use the RMFMS complete waiver. We will use the waiver we currently have which is the RMFMS waiver. Need to have members complete and sign before members attend a field trip.

Review of the show's committee meeting from Sunday, January 7th. Mickey Snook wants to talk with someone from the committee. He has a list of places that will advertise FREE for the show. This year's show will be being held at the Nerdy Nuts Expo at the fairgrounds. A floor plan made by Debbie V. was passed around. Currently there are 11 spaces rented by 8 vendors.

There are 16 Show cases to be used. Currently six are claimed.

An Information table for the club is currently located on floor plan next to Silent Auction. This table may be relocated to give the Silent Auction area more room. Possible relocation to the "rest area" in front of the building if construction of the concession area is completed by show time. Other locations at end of show case area or by the back garage door (between SDSMT table and table #34) since garage door will not be used during show.

Debbie V. will call Ashley at the fairgrounds to get an update on the construction status.

All agree that advertising is important and needs a lot of attention.

Leslie will also check with Sign Express if there is a way to change information on banner (ie date) without having to make a new banner every year.

"Save the Date" cards were made and will be mailing out some to our vendors. Reviewed mailing prices, priority or regular mail.Due to size, regular mail price is less expensive. 50 cards were set to Rod in AZ to hand out.

Myesa is waiting on a response from Summer Nights about setting up an information table during events.

Reviewing if we should have "rack cards" made to help advertise. It is possible that there is a company contracted to hand out the "rack card". Need to stop by a place, Millstone, and ask.

Debra is still compiling a list of places to advertise with. Mickey has a list of places to advertise for free. Debra will be calling him to set up a time to visit him. Debra is

finishing the paragraph for the newspaper/magazines "classifies" and online event calendars.

Debra will drive by the back of the expo building at the fairgrounds to see if there is a fenced in area for the prospecting club to set up. We don't want people slipping in the back door without paying.

Minerals That Require Special Care by Deborah Vick

In the world of mineral collecting there is a wide variety to collect. Most minerals are beautiful as is and don't require much care in displaying or storing them, yet there are some minerals that take special care and protection from atmospheric influences. This table shows different influences and the minerals that need protection.

Loses water in excessively dry air

Autunite	Melanterite
Borax	Natron
Chalcathite	Thenardite
Halotrichite	Torbernite
Kernite	Trona
Laumonitie	Zeunerite

In addition some chalcedonies and agates lose water, become pale in color and less translucent. Chrysoprase changes to very pale shades as water is lost. Opals also lose water and may crack.

Gains water in moist air

Some minerals do better stored in a dark place until viewed. If on display do not place in direct sunlight.

Apatite (pink type loses color) Argentite (alters) Beryl (brown or orange types loses color, usually changes to pale pink) Cerargyrite (alters and changes color) Cinnabar (alters and changes color) Fluorite (purple and green types changes colors) Orpiment (decomposes) Proustite (alters and becomes gray) Pyrargyrite (alters and becomes gray) Quartz (amethyst, smoky quartz, and rose quartz sometimes becomes paler in color Realgar (alters into orpiment) Spodumene (Kunzite becomes pale in color or loses all color) Topaz (brown topaz loses color) Tyuyamunite (alters) Vivianite (quickly changes to dull dark blue-violet color

Sulfer crystals are damaged by rapid temperature changes

Crystals containing water-filled cavities can be damaged by freezing

So enjoy all those wonderful minerals that are out there to be found. Once home and in your personal collection care must be done to preserve the collection for many generations to admire.
