## WESTERN DAKOTA GEM AND MINERAL SOCIETY (WDGMS) FIELD TRIP RULES, SAFETY, CLAIMS AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY DOCUMENT

## FIELD TRIP RULES

All participants are required to sign a current Field Trip Rules, Claims, Safety and Release of Liability Document. This document is also required for minor children (under the age of 18), signed by the parent or legal guardian. In addition, the minor(s) must be under the supervision of the parent or legal guardian at all times.

<u>SIGN UP</u>: Members are required to sign up for field trips, notify the field trip leader(s) if they decide to not attend after signing up or if they need to leave the field trip site early.

PETS: Pets are not allowed on field trips on private property

<u>RETURNING TO FIELD TRIP SITES</u>: When a field trip takes place on private property, club members may not return to the site without the explicit permission and authorization from the land or claim owner(s).

**<u>COLLECTING</u>**: Collecting specimens is for non-commercial personal use.

## SAFETY

<u>SAFETY</u> is of upmost importance to the WDGMS. We want everyone to have fun, collect nice <u>specimens</u>, and return home without any injuries. Please be aware of the following:

\*Slips, trips, and falls: Watch where you are walking or climbing. Steep slopes and ravines are especially hazardous. Rocks and roots protruding out of the ground are also potential hazards.

\*Heavy lifting and prying: Carry or pry what you are physically capable of without causing an injury. Collection bags become very heavy, make several trips to your car if need be. Watch how much you lift and your posture in doing so.

\*Falling rocks: Watch for falling rocks! Large cobbles and boulders may become loose and roll down or fall from walls and roofs of pits. Do not throw rocks of any size! That rock may hit a fellow rock hound. Watch out for collectors working next to, above or below you.

\*Rock picks, Hammers and Chisels: Use in a safe manner according to manufacturer's recommendations. Avoid mushroomed chisel heads as the flared edges could become a dangerous projectile. Wear safety glasses or goggles as well as gloves. Do not pound on rock pick heads as they splinter on impact resulting in dangerous projectiles.

\*Dehydration: Water is important and is the best fluid to prevent dehydration on a field trip. A dry mouth is a sign of dehydration. Going too long without water could cause dehydration and a trip to the hospital.

\*Snakes and other predators: Snakes and other predators are out and about and we are invading their home. Know what is behind that bush or rock. Rattlesnakes are very dangerous when surprised or stepped on. Watch where you walk or place your hands.

\*Drive safely: Field trips may involve driving on difficult, primitive and unimproved roads in remote locations. It is your responsibility to determine your driving and navigation skills and if your vehicle can handle the road conditions encountered on the trip.

\*Health Issues: Field trips may involve extreme, unpredictable weather conditions, as well as hiking and collecting at high altitudes with limited oxygen. Be sure your physical condition can meet these challenges. In most cases, remote areas have no means of timely rescue and evacuation to medical facilities.
