May 17th Show meeting minutes

Debbie V called the meeting to order at 10:05 am with 12 members attending.

Debbie will talk with Ashley about having access to the building to place tape on floor for vendor locations.

There was a discussion about cash boxes and what tables needed them for efficiency; admissions, club info, silent auction and/ geode cracking. We will sell the canvas bas at the club info table and geodes at the silent auction. There will be 2 Squares for credit/debit card purchases. One at the Silent Auction with tax and the other at Admissions without tax. Entrance fee is \$5 for adults, under 12 free with paying adult.

Geode Cracking: have 57 geodes, need more. Leslie will purchase more. If attendant purchases the geode from vendor or us the cracking is free.

Jr. Rockhounds: Lori B stated she needs to know how much she can spend for the Jr. Rockhounds activity center. Items that are needed: Dino, rings, erasers, pencils, bracelets, sandwich bags, paper towels, makers, wipes and sandbags. Kelli motioned an allotment of \$300 for supplies and Rod W seconded, motion passed. Lori gave Jason stones to polish for the sandbox. Need club member to save their egg cartons. Put notice in the Ammonite.

Microphone and sound system are rented. Will have 2 mics and 2 wireless speakers. Not sure if the mics are wireless, will check on this.

Signage: Leslie ordered two more flags. Kelli motioned to reimburse Leslie; Debbie seconded. Motion passed. Debra will order signs for the walls. Geode Cracking will have price for geode purchase.

Showcases: Leslie will order the Best of Show plaque for the showcases from J and J. There are 16 cases and 6/7 are currently reserved. Need to advertise in Ammonite and Facebook about the showcases.

Badges: Need to get the names of vendors and their staff to make name tags. Need to purchase more lanyards.

Potluck: Marie will put together the online potluck system for club members. Need to check with Ashley from fairgrounds to see if we can use the hallway in the concession area for the table of food. Will need extension cords, check the trailer. Walmart can print the club logo and 50th anniversary on cake. Put in Ammonite for club members to look for an email for the potluck sign up.


Display cases are available for club members for the show. Contact a show committee member for more information.

How to Dye Quartz at Home

Ever been at a tourist rock shop or a souvenir shop and seen brightly colored crystals especially Quartz. First of all they are not natural and second you can do the same affect at home. All you need is a few supplies.

Supplies

- quartz crystal
- safety goggles
- metal tongs
- heat resistant work gloves
- hand held butane torch
- bucket
- water soluble dye
- Step 1 Fill bucket with cold water
- **Step 2** Using a higher concentration of dye than what is needed for dyeing cloth, dissolve the dye in the bucket fully
- **Step 3** Must put on safety goggles and gloves. This step is very important!
- **Step 4** Turn on the butane torch then pick up the crystal with the metal tongs
- **Step 5** Apply flame to crystal for about a minute
- **Step 6** Drop the crystal into the bucket

This process will cause the Quartz crystal to crackle. The dye will absorb in the cracks and change the overall color of the crystal.

Please note: This process should be done by a responsible adult as there are many risks involved. The piece could shatter and cause shards to fly, hence the safety goggles. There are also inherent risks involved with using the butane torch. Last but not least use a bucket that can withstand the abuse it will receive.

Also, do this experiment **OUTSIDE**!!!
