Why Color Should Not Be The ONLY Characteristic of Identifying Minerals

There are many minerals that yes, can be identified by color alone. Gold, Azurite, Rhodochrosite, and Dioptase are a few.

Others come in many different colors that sometimes can confuse the beginning collector. Quartz and Calcite are two notable minerals. Quartz in it's pure form is colorless yet when traces of other elements are present then other colors are found. Purple, white, pink, green, black, yellow, orange and brown are some of the colors.

Calcite is the other 'peacock' of minerals. It's various colors include white, clear, gray, yellow, green, blue, brown and black.

Some minerals change color when exposed to light, heat and radiation. Realgar changes to Paraealgar upon repeated exposure to light. Prousite and Viviante darker and Kunzite fades with exposure to light. Some gemstone varieties of Topaz, Beryl, and Corundum are heat treated to produce deep colored stones from dull stones in the gemstone industry.

Other minerals oxidize or tarnish. Silver, Copper, Bornite and Chalcopyrite are some examples.

The most unusual mineral is the gemstone Alexandrite a variety of Chrysoberyl. It is dark green in natural light but turns purple in artificial light.

Agates are another mineral that is artificially enhanced in various ways including dying.

Because of all these factors and variations when trying to identify a mineral use different identification marks alongside color, Hardness and crystal habitat are two.

Discussion: Can anybody else list some minerals that are difficult to identify with color only?
