May Guest Speaker - Dr. Chris Jass

Dr. Chris Jass, Director of Research from The Mammoth Site in Hot Springs, was our club's guest speaker for our May meeting. Dr. Jass gave a power point presentation on the history and beginnings of The Mammoth Site. He explained it all started when a gentleman by the name of George Hanson was bulldozing an area in Hot Springs for a housing project. Mr. Hanson's blade struck something and rather than continuing he stopped and saw that it was a long tusk. Phil Anderson, the land owner, halted the housing project until it could be further investigated. Mr. Anderson invited Dr. Jim Mead and his small crew to the site. They spent 10 days excavating, salvaging and stabilizing bones, tusks and other fragments. Many of the items collected had nowhere to go so they went home with the crew. The following summer Dr. Agenbroad and Dr. Mead lead another team to continue excavating the site. By the end of the summer, land owner Phil Anderson, realized his 14 acres of land was more valuable as a geological resource than as a housing project. Through community commitment and Mr. Anderson's generosity, The Mammoth Site of Hot Springs was born. This is the 50th Anniversary of the Mammoth Site. Dr. Jass's presentation was in-depth and inspiring. It was interesting to find out that at The Mammoth Site you can see fossils "in situ" or as they were discovered. This is very unique as the museum is also an active dig site. We encourage everyone to visit the site.

The Size Dilemma

Every collector enjoys what they have in their collections, no matter what it is. The largest concern facing any collector is what size should their pieces be?

Too big and the collection takes over the collector's home. They also can become too expensive. One does not need to strive to get a museum sized piece when they live in limited space.

So what size to collect? It depends on several factors. The price, the quality of the specimens and last but not least the display space one has.

To help out in this tricky area the American Federation of Mineralogical Society (AFMS) has described different dimensions for the most common sizes a collector can go off of for their collections.

The smallest size is the <u>Micro-Mount</u>. These specimens require magnification to truly appreciate the beauty of the mineral. This size is excellent for minerals that are only found with good quality crystals in that size. Collections of this size takes up the least space.

Next size up is the <u>Thumbnail</u>. Specimens of this size are usually displayed in a cube size box called a 'Perky' box. AMFS states the this size is about 1 inch in any direction.

The next step up in the <u>Miniature</u> size. This is larger then the Thumbnail and usually 2 Inch max. in any direction.

Cabinet has two different categories. The <u>small cabinet</u> is 4 inches in any direction and the cabinet is over the 4 inch size.

There are many factors that go into making a collector happy yet the most critical part is the size. Rocks and minerals can easily take over one's living quarters if not properly monitored, so **size does really matter!!**

Help is needed to re-cover some of the display case liners.

The material has been purchased & been laid them out to see how many cases we can cover - I think 6. They NEED to be cut out & attached to cardboard.

We need some <u>large pieces of cardboard</u> in good shape - no folds, holes, etc.The back & bottom liners measure **22 1/2" x 43 1/2".**

We will need some place to spread out the material, cut iron & attach. Reserve a room at the Library OR if anyone has space in their home, garage or basement? Also a <u>"full size" ironing board.</u> I do have an iron (although it is rarely used). (Editor's note: I have a full size board and an working iron)
